Kris called our business meeting to order and began by re-capping the June meeting. Minutes were approved with minor corrections, which Kris will make and submit to members, and for our web page.

***** **TREASURER'S REPORT** ~ Michelle and see attachment **Budget 2018-19** ALPHA DELTA account balance = \$419.15 as of the end of June. ALPHA DELTA Scholarship account (Edward Jones Investments) balance = \$4, 794.98. Marie Husby Fund (Edward Jones Investments) = \$10, 369.03 Gasparovich Fund (Home Street Bank) = \$6, 996.17.

Michelle gave a very thorough and detailed report on our Chapter budget. We discussed the 2017-2018 Actual Budget, 2018-2019 Proposed Budget A and Budget B. Budget B included \$1000. from the Marie Husby Fund to be used to pay for the King County Breakfast in March and one other cultural event (to be determined). See number 6 below for additional Budget discussion.

A Motion was made to accept Budget B and to review the Marie Husby Bequest to determine if we are honoring the intent of the Husby Bequest. The Motion was passed after further discussion.

GASPAROVITCH FUND

Last year we did not make a final decision about what to do with the remaining funds in the Gasparovich account.

At this meeting, members present moved, discussed, and approved moving money (initially \$3000 and final ALL) of the money remaining in the Gasparovich Fund (Home Street Bank) to an investment account at Edward Jones, where it has the potential to earn higher return. The new EJ account would be called the Gasparovich Memorial Education Fund. This new fund would be used for scholarships (stipends) for members' professional/personal development, teacher recognition, and new teacher grants.

The Scholarship/World Fellowship Committee (Joan & Stella) is tasked with setting up a process for disbursement of the funds, including guidelines and application process. The committee will report their findings at the February 9th meeting.

Joan and Stella would like up to 3 others interested in helping with this task to join them. Please contact them directly if you are interested/willing to join with them for this short-term project.

Once this is done, the original Alpha Delta Scholarship Fund would be reserved for helping send members to state, regional, and national meetings. It is the goal of our chapter to help make it possible for any member to attend these gatherings for the benefit of all.

BUDGET CONCERNS

Members present discussed possible ways to sustainably fund our chapter without another duesincrease such as a **holiday potluck instead of catered meal** (savings ov \$200-300—almost enough to offset the state dues increase) and taking a payment from the Huseby Fund to pay for the King County Breakfast which would release that line item to operations, etc.

Budget considerations will be re-visited during 2018-19.

The 2018-19 Budget 'B' was adopted by a vote of members present.
