***** MEMBER FORUM

Loveday arrived in period costume with photos and fascinated us with the many stories of the Women of WWI! We learned not only of the new jobs and career paths in agriculture, factories, offices, and medicine that opened for women as they replaced men who had gone to the war, but the social changes that rocked Britain as well, with the shrinking servant class and the loss of the great estates. Many women also provided clerical and medical work for the Armed Forces, and over 50,000 were in the Secret Service. When the war ended, women pushed suffrage forward won the right to vote. However, because of the losses of the war, by 1918 women had only a 10% chance of marriage, creating a class of over 2 million "surplus women" responsible for their own financial security—yet they still received only 2/3 the pay men did for the same job! Thank you, Loveday! We learned so much from your engaging presentation!
